Dr. Galindo is Professor of Christian Education at Baptist Theological Seminary at Richmond and is the Executive Director of Educational Consultants. An educator, and author, Dr. Galindo is a consultant in teacher training and education, congregational leadership development, as well as family systems theory as applied to congregations and organizations. He is a popular seminar and workshop leader in the areas of education and instruction and in Bowen systems theory as applied to parenting, congregational life, and leadership development. He is the author of numerous magazine and journal articles, and books including *Hidden Lives of Congregations*, which will be the basis of his four presentations at CCRTP. This book provides one of the most far-reaching looks into the invisible nature of faith communities written in recent years. Informed by family systems theory and grounded in a wide-ranging ecclesiological understanding, Galindo unpacks clearly the factors of congregational lifespan, size, spirituality, and identity and shows how these work together to form the congregation's hidden life.

Invited responders to Dr. Galindo's presentations will identify implications of teaching as leadership from the perspectives of resource development, congregational education ministry, and the academy.
