Support for the NCC is based on voluntary action for the common good of the ecumenical movement and the church of Jesus Christ. It is a tradition of giving and sharing that is essential to our common life. To assure that our work merits the respect and trust of our contributors, and that donors and prospective donors can have full confidence in the NCC and its mission work, we declare that all donors have these rights:

- To be informed of the mission of the NCC, the way the resources will be used and our capacity to use donations effectively for their intended purposes.
- To be informed of the identity of those serving on the Governing Board and to expect the Board to exercise prudent judgment in its stewardship responsibilities.
- To have access to the NCC's most recent financial reports.
- To be assured their gifts will be used for the purposes for which they were given.
- To receive appropriate acknowledgement and recognition. To be assured that information about their donations is handled with respect and with confidentiality to the extent provided by the law.
- To expect that all relationships with individuals representing the NCC will be professional in nature.
- To be informed whether those seeking donations are volunteers, employees of the NCC or hired solicitors.
- To know that the NCC does not share, rent, or sell its donor mailing list to any other organization.
- To feel free to ask questions when making a donation and to receive prompt, truthful and forthright answers.
